

NATIONAL PROGRAMME FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE ACQUIS (NPAA) 2022- 2025

After receiving the status of a candidate country for membership in the European Union in 2012, the Government adopted the National Programme for the Adoption of the Acquis (NPAA) on 28 February 2013. In accordance with the development of the European integration process, the document has been revised three times so far. The first revision of the NPAA was adopted by the Government with the opening of negotiations on accession to the European Union in 2014, while the second revision was adopted after the screening was completed – during the receipt of the screening report, the preparation of action plans for meeting the benchmarks for opening negotiations in particular chapters, and the preparation of negotiating positions – in 2016. The third revision was adopted on 1 March 2018, in order to align the deadlines with the current state of the European integration process.

In item 3 of the Conclusion on the adoption of the third revision of the National Programme for the Adoption of the Acquis (2018- 2021), the Government has appointed the Ministry of European Integration as responsible for proposing the next revision of the National Programme for the Adoption of the Acquis (NPAA), in accordance with the needs of the process of accession of the Republic of Serbia to the European Union.

Proceeding from the need for the NPAA to be adapted to the requirements set by the innovative methodology for accession to the European Union, the Government has adopted a new document, which will be revised in accordance with the needs of the processes, in order for the NPAA to be, at any moment, a clear overview of the obligations stemming from the process of European integrations and harmonization of legislation. At the same time, the NPAA provides insight into the current situation in the cluster and the chapter of negotiations, in accordance with the applicable methodology for EU accession.

The drafting of the new NPAA (2022- 2025) was carried out by the competent ministries, special organizations and services of the Government, as well as other institutions, which are part of the coordination system regulated by the Government Decision on the Establishment of the Coordination Body for the Process of the Accession of The Republic of Serbia to the European Union and the Negotiating Team for Accession of the Republic of Serbia to the European Union, all in accordance with the guidelines of the chief negotiator – the Minister of European Integration.

The NPAA 2022- 2025 contains legislative plans, as well as measures aimed at establishing the institutional and administrative capacities necessary for the implementation of harmonized legislation. During the drafting of the NPAA, a rough projection of the financial aspect of the implementation of the NPAA was made, in accordance with the practice established during the drafting of previous versions of this document. ¹
